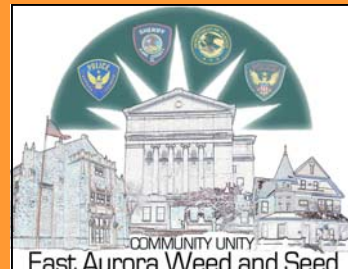
EAHS HOSTS CHRIS WALK
