

- I. One Team One Plan Dr. Jennifer Norrell and Mrs. Heather Kincaid
 - A. All employees and partners at East Aurora School District will work towards a common set of goals to implement and monitor the plan
 - B. SAT suite of assessments will be used in grades 8 12.
 - C. The SAT Suite has two sections: Evidence Based Reading and Writing and Math
 - D. The Reading questions are embedded in science and social studies passages
 - E. Engaging all teachers including Core and Encore to implement and monitor standards
 - F. Data reports include overall performance, section scores, cross-test scores, subscores, and question analysis.



G. Each school will write three School Improvement goals based on three Worthy Targets focused on Reading, Math, and Attendance/Graduation.

- A. 5th/6th and 7th/8th grade courses are a yearlong STEM Fine Arts course provided to students as an elective choice
 - Experiences integrate STEM science, technology, engineering and math
 - Includes traditional art, design studio and Makerspace
 - Integrates design thinking process

- A. One PPA currently covers the building
- B. One additional PPA is needed to supervise other areas

IX. Elementary Band and Music Resources – Ms. Heather Kincaid

- A. School-based funding increased from \$10 \$20 per student provided to each principal in 2016 2017
