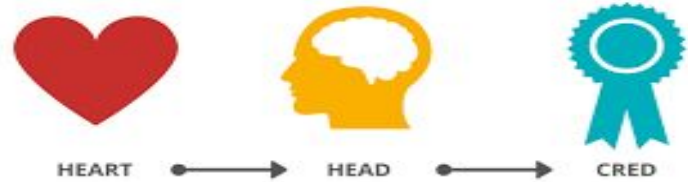
Monday, January 13th

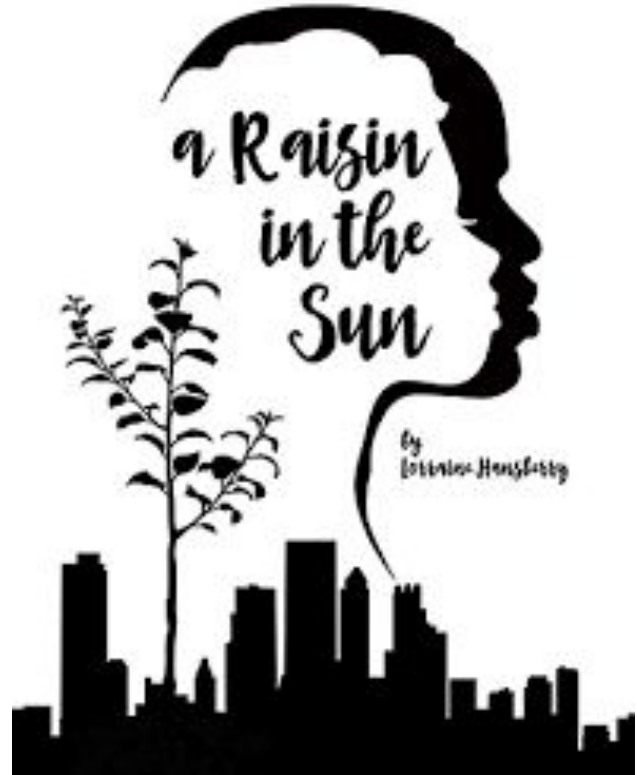


Wednesday, January 17th
