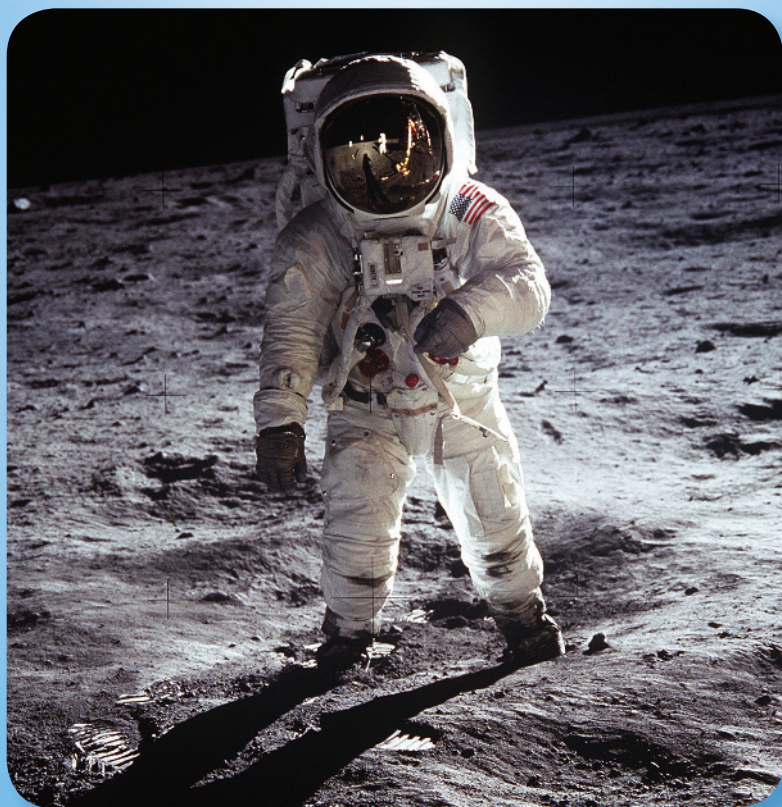

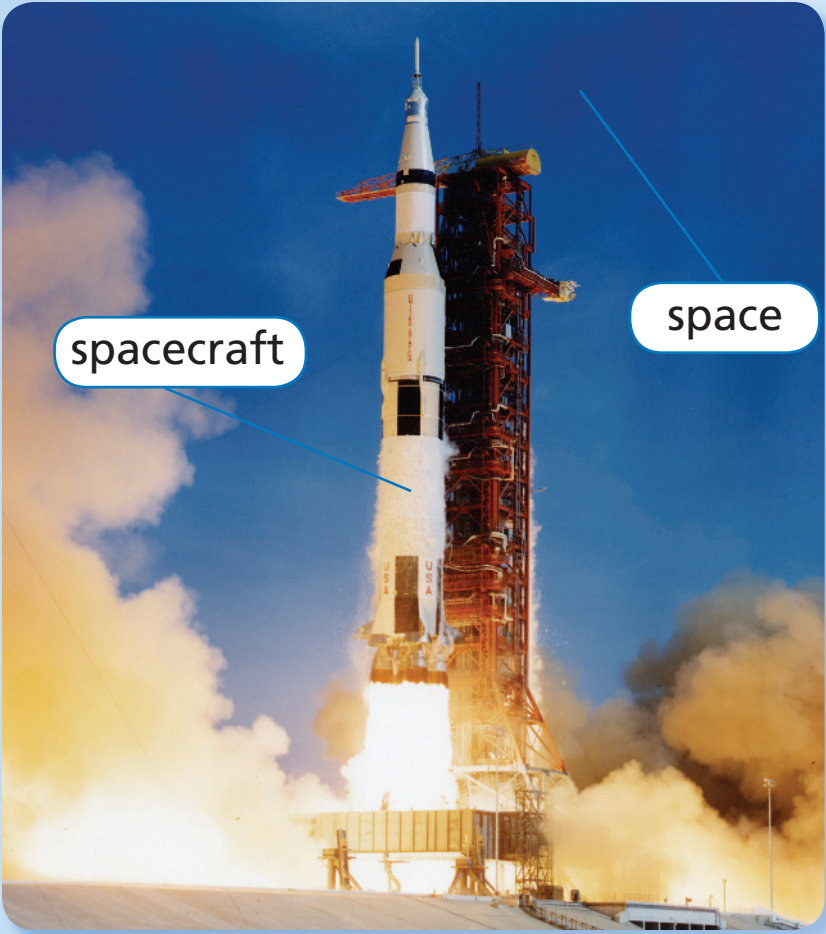

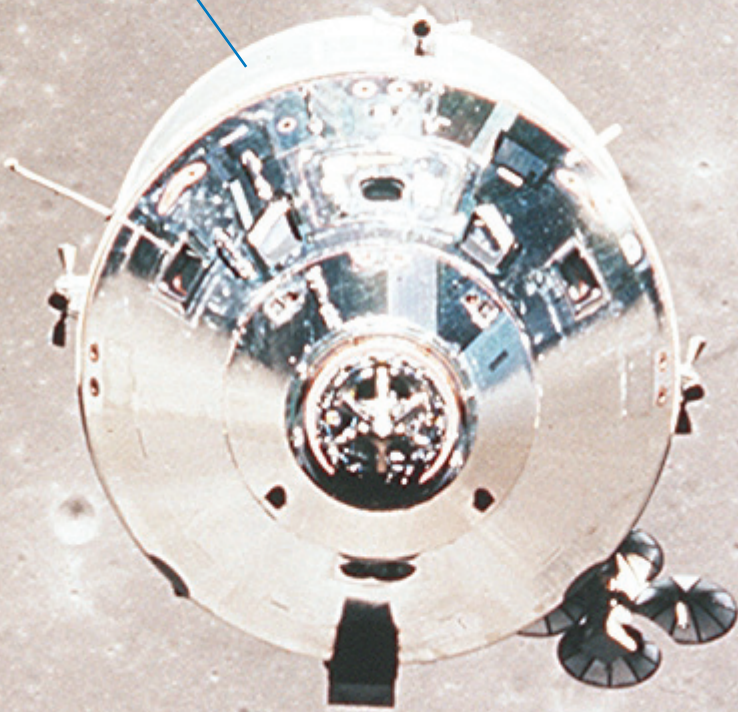


In 1969, a spacecraft went

It was called Apollo 11.



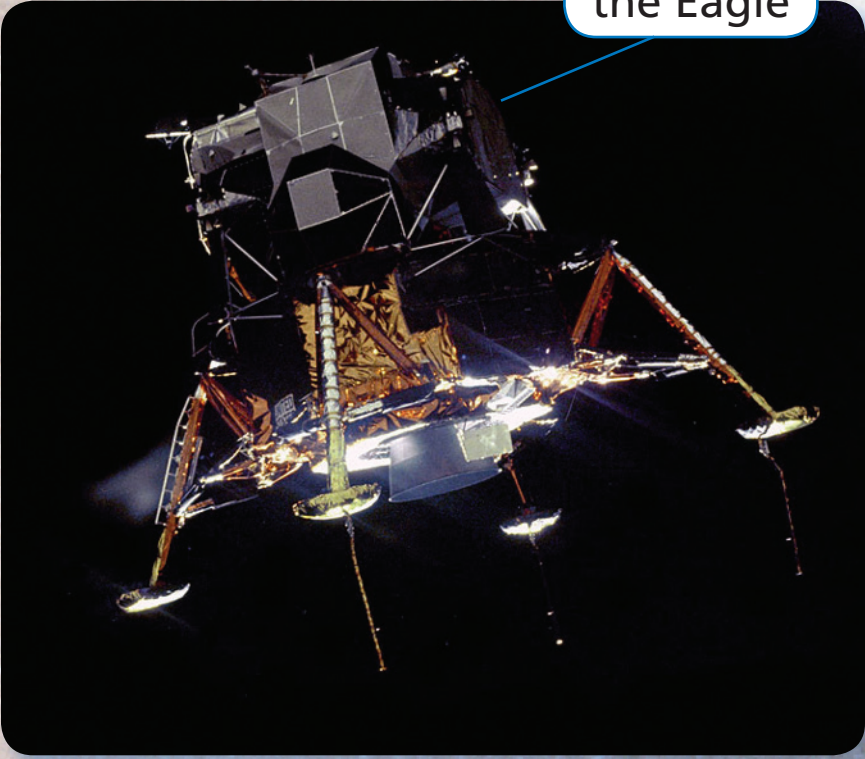
These were the astronauts.

the Columbia

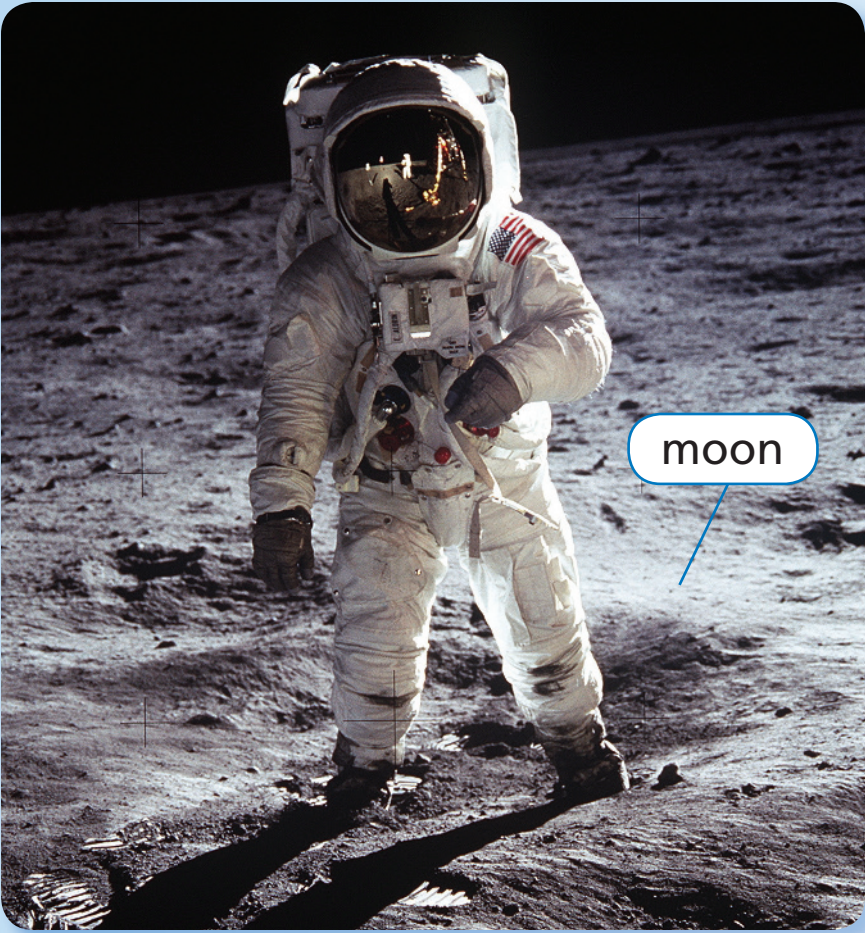


The spacecraft had two parts.
