



This unit focuses on the skills needed to find and keep a job. This lesson provides two want ads describing different jobs. Team members should understand that finding a job that matches with your skills, interests and needs is directly linked to how much you like your job. Reviewing these job ads can facilitate discussions about readiness to work and important job skills.

Instructional Routine



Introduce

- Introduce the activity by asking a focus question. For example, say, "Where would you like to work—in a floral shop or at a construction site?
- Explain to team members that they will explore specific jobs within two different job categories. Team members will consider whether their individual work preferences and skills match the specific jobs presented. Tell team members that their job is to decide if they like a described job and if they have the skills to do the job.
- Review the learning goal with team members: I will identify if I like a job and have the skills to do it.
- Display a Job Exploration form. Point out and encourage team members to help identify the Job Category, Job Location and Job Title.

Model

- Read the job preferences. Pause after each and discuss if you like the preference. Model placing a check in the box next to preferred preference.
- Model reviewing the Skills Needed column in a similar manner.
- Next, answer the questions at the bottom of the form. Discuss each question and encourage team members to comment.

Provide team members with a Job Exploration Form and any alternative forms of writing and communication support needed.

Discuss and review what team members know about the given job category. (e.g., Name all the jobs they can think of in this category.) Discuss the location and job title, and what a person with this title may be expected to do. Encourage students to consider other jobs that are also available in this specific locátion. • Have team members complete the Job Exploration Form. Encourage discussion by asking questions.

Provide Practice

Level 3: Have the team member tell whether the job is preferred or not and state reasons for preference.

Level 2: Have the team member identify tasks for each job and state which they like and dislike.

Level 1: Have the team member select a job activity of interest (may be errorless choice).

• Have each team member determine if this would be a realistic job option.

Review

Review the job presented and discuss preferences and skills associated with that job.

Instructional Routine



 Introduce the activity by asking a focus question. For example, say, "Where should I look to find job openings—in my locker or the want ads?"

ntroduce

- Explain that many businesses find workers by putting ads in the newspaper and online.
- It is important to understand the information in the want ad to know if you might want the job.
- Tell team members that they will be reading want ads to find a job. For example, say "We will be reading two Help Wanted Ads. Your job is to choose which job you like. You will practice applying for that job later."
- Review the learning goal with team members: I will read Help Wanted Ads and choose a job I like.

Model

- Discuss things that you would want to know about a job (location, job title, job description, job skills and attitudes, and hours and times).
- Display one of the Help Wanted Ads. Read the ad, asking questions on topics listed above, and determine if you like the job. Point out the specific places on the ad that may help answer questions. For example, ask, "How many hours would I have to work?" Point out the Hours and Times section. "It says I would need to work Tuesday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m."

Provide team members with the most appropriate text format on the basis of each team member's skills and needs.

Provide Practice

- Read or have team members read the Help Wanted Ads. Encourage discussion of each of the areas in detail (location, job title, job description, job skills and attitudes, and hours and times).
- After reading and discussing both Help Wanted Ads, each team member will select the job that most closely matches their preferences and skills. Note: Team member will apply for this job in Lesson 18.

Level 3: Have the team member choose the preferred job and state a reason for preference.

Level 2: Have the team member identify liked job tasks in order to select a preferred job.

Level 1: Have the team member select a job of interest (may be errorless choice).

Review

Review both jobs and the skills needed for each.
