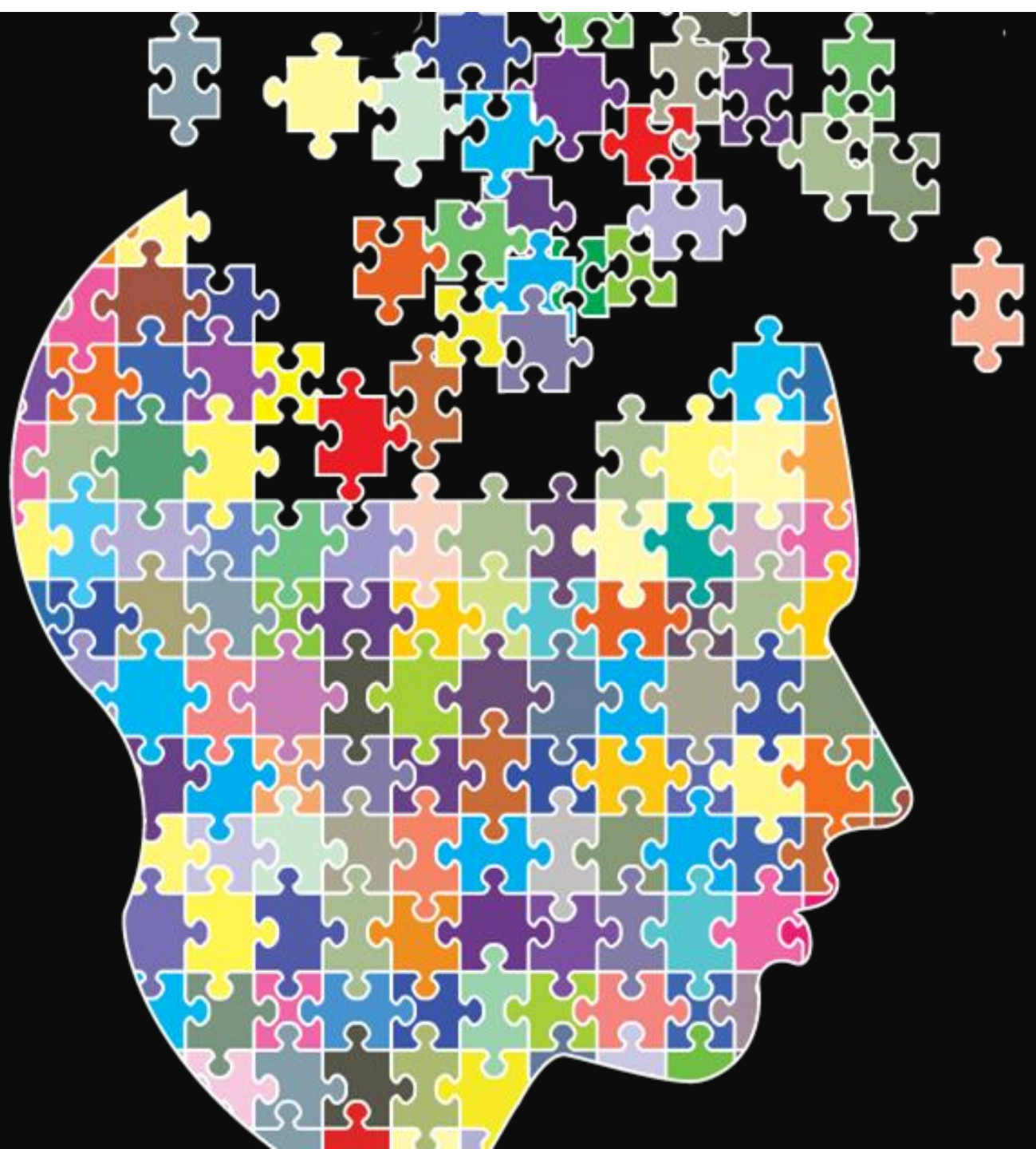

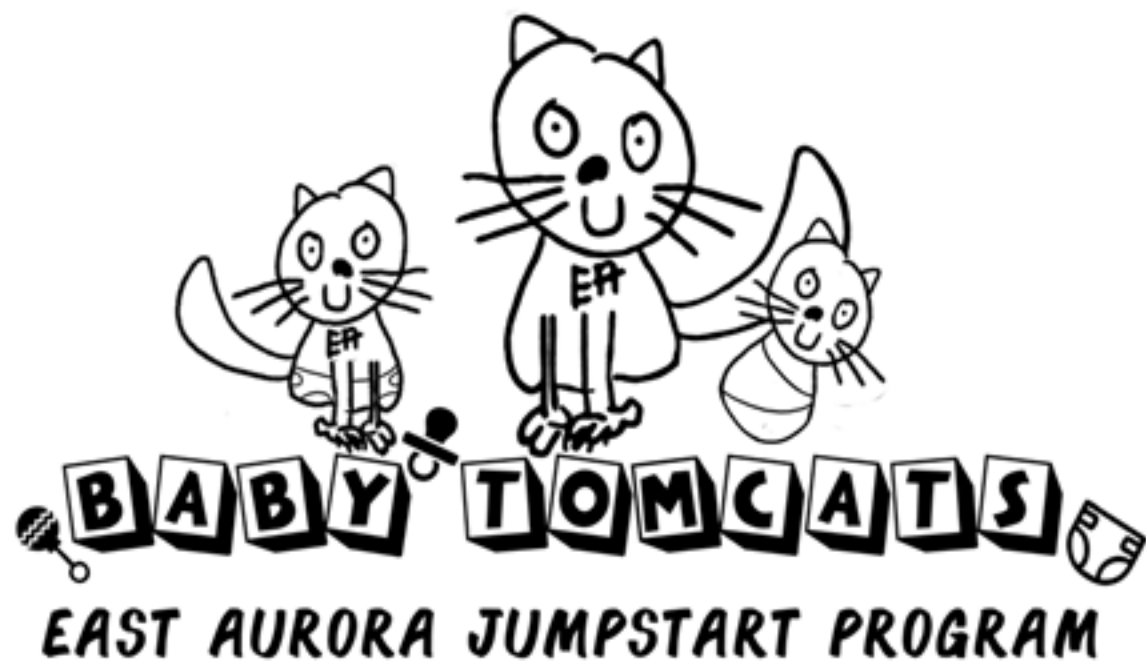

- The name Kwanzaa is derived from the phrase “matunda ya kwanza” which means “first fruits” in Swahili.

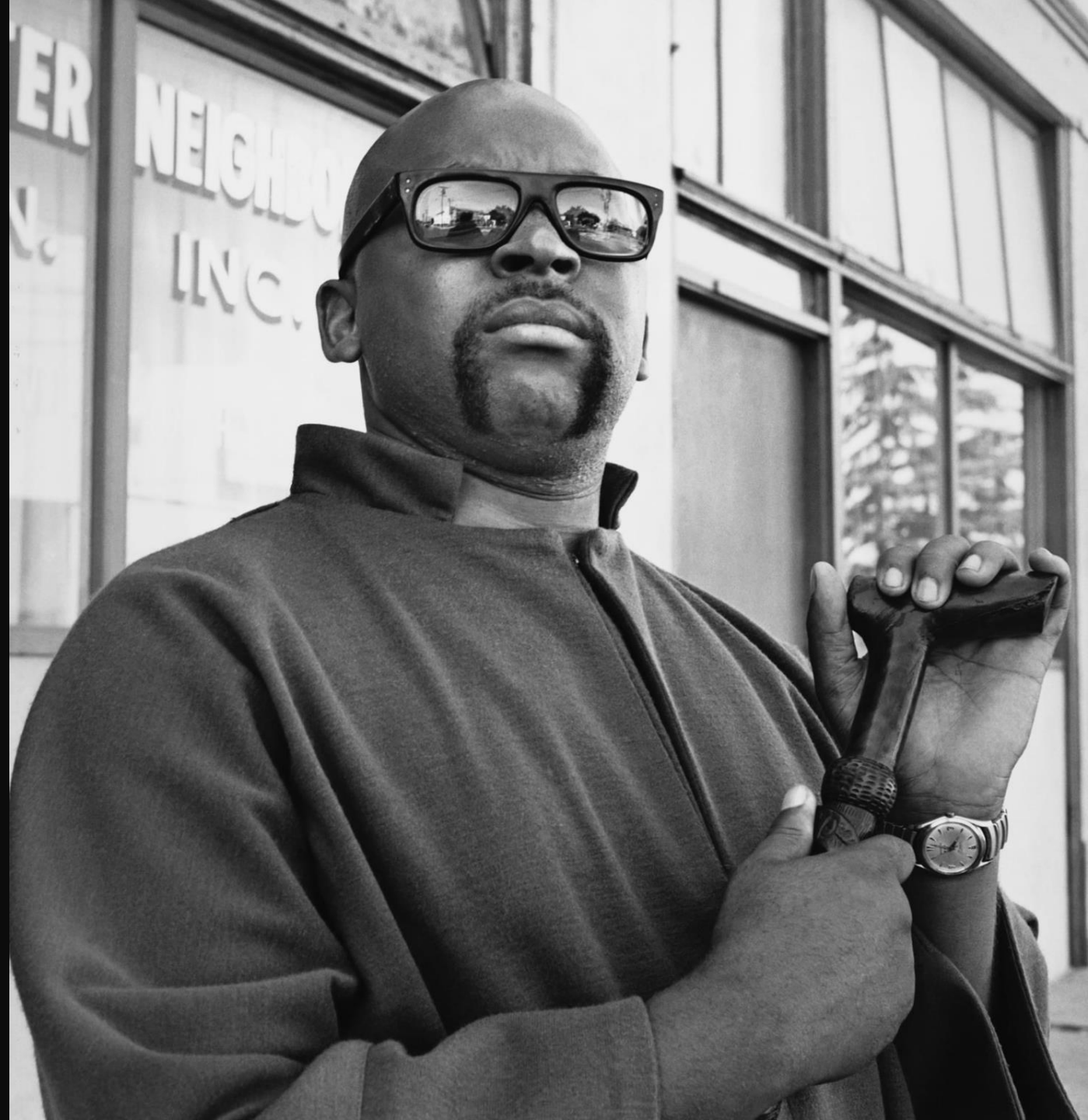
