Parental Involvement

Definition: The amount of participation a parent has when it comes to their child's education and the development of life skills.

Parental Involvement

(A) Staying up to date on what is happening in the classroom and knowing the correct safety procedures for the school.

Parent Involvement / Social

- (B) a positive social experience / knowing what activities their children are involved in.
- ▶ (C) inviting friends to play at your home. Evaluate their peer's.....
- ▶ (D) You've got to jump in with both feet.



Educational

► (E) The earlier a parent can intercede with his or her child's education, the more successful the child will ultimately be.

Disciplinary

▶ (F) By understanding why your child is being disciplined at school, will keep you involved in the disciplinary process with the school.

Safety

▶ (G) Parents should not only know the safety risks from other students, but should also know the warning signs of violence within their own children. .

Setting Parenting Goals

- A parenting goal is a goal focused on what you as a parent can do to help your child succeed more.
- (1) What specific actions will YOU take to support your child's strengths and weaknesses?
- ▶ (2) How will you facilitate their development?
- (3) What will the outcome look like?

Step 1: What is the outcome?

Once you can see what the end will look like for you and your child/family, then you can move onto setting a goal for YOURSELF.

- Step 2: What is my parent goal?
- What part of that outcome involves changing your own behavior? What can you personally do to support your child?

- Step 3: What do I know about my child's strengths and weaknesses?
- You should consider educating yourself about what it is that you're dealing with.
- Understand your child's strengths and weaknesses in order to understand what the best approach to helping them is.

- Step 4: What specific actions do I need to take?
- Detail the SPECIFIC things you will do to achieve those goals.
- Break the goal down into super small, super actionable steps.
- Start small and focus on things you can do each day.
