2022 Mini-Grants

The Aurora East Educational Foundation awarded 22 Mini-Grants for a total of \$26,504.28 The grant funds were used for field trips to Medieval Times, a Shakespeare Festival, and an initial payment for a trip to Washington, DC; to providing soft seating for students; to purchasing a percussion set for the drum program; to a kitchen and grocery check lanes simulations; to providing cooking supplies for the independent living program; to supplies for the Peer Buddy portion of the Special Olympics program; to replacing worn-out books in the library; to purchasing camera equipment for the yearbook staff; to purchasing supplies to the Special Education transition program for adult students; to purchasing emergent literacy textbooks for students with disabilities; to supplies for a green vegetable

On the horizon, the AEEF is working on creating a Pathways to Careers Scholarship Endowment for students who chose pathways in fields that do not require baccalaureate degree, professionals like police and firemen, trades like

carpenters, plumbers, electricians, and medical professionals such as lab technicians, dental arts careers and many, many other fields.
